Sophocles, *Trachiniae*

- 1) The play contains two reports of Heracles' battle with Achelous, one by Deianira and one by the Chorus. Exactly what happened? Account for the differences in the two reports.
- 2) The play offers two accounts of events in Oechalia and their consequences: by Lichas and by the messenger. Note the differences in the two reports. What exactly happened? Examine Lichas' version as a garbled version of the truth.
- 3) Assess the character of Deianira, in her reactions to Heracles' actions, to Iole, and in her final decision.
