

## Group Progress Presentations

Roughly every two weeks, teams will prepare a progress presentation for the class. These presentations should include:

1. *any* progress that has been made by the group and *anything* the group has learned since the last progress presentation
2. any positive results obtained since the last progress presentation as well as a brief account of any failed attempts and why they failed
3. future goals to be accomplished before the next progress presentation
4. any questions that the team would like the class to discuss.

The presentation should be no more than 10 minutes long. The purpose of these presentations is to keep teams moving forward on the project, have an opportunity for classmates to learn from and help each other, and to practice succinct oral communication.

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Reminder: There is no such thing as “finishing” research – it’s an ongoing process. In this course, you will provide *a solution* in a certain timeframe so the goal is to continually make progress and by the end you will have something of interest to report to the liaison. Research is challenging and an investment in time (and rarely goes smoothly) but do not give up and focus on continuously moving forward on the project!
